

Lynne Cheney is the author of five books for children: the New York Times bestsellers America: A Patriotic Primer, A is for Abigail: An Almanac of Amazing American Women, When Washington Crossed the Delaware: A Wintertime Story for Young Patriots, and most recently Our Fifty States



(9780689867170, SAL, \$18.99). She is a 💻

senior fellow at the American Enterprise Institute and former chair of the National Endowment for the Humanities. She lives in Washington, D.C., with her husband, Vice President Richard B. Cheney. A long-time advocate of teaching America's history to children, Mrs. Cheney recently shared her passion for history and good books with the CATS staff.

Q. What inspired you to write your first children's book?

A. My grandchildren, first and foremost. When you have little kids in your life, it's fun to communicate with them in different ways about things important to you, and history is very important to me.

A. It's hard to choose, but Robin Glasser and I did name the book after Abigail Adams, and she is a very appealing figure. Born in days when women weren't expected to go to school, couldn't own property, and couldn't vote, she was smart and self-aware enough to know that things should be different and to tell her husband John to "remember the ladies" when he was making laws for our new nation.

Q. Now that you've worked with Robin Preiss Glasser on several books, has the collaboration process evolved or changed at all?

A. We work very well together and have since the beginning, but our experience on previous books means that we understand each other very well by now. Really, I sometimes think she can read my mind! What a joy to collaborate with a person of such talent. I can't imagine whom else I could have worked with on a project as big and complicated as *Our 50 States*.

Q. *Our 50 States: A Family Adventure Across America* features numerous historical sites, landmarks, and natural treasures. Do you have a favorite American

Q. From where do you get the ideas for your books?

A. I'm not sure. I think they just kind of germinate and then one day blossom. Sometimes the title, or some version of it comes first. That's the way it was with *America*, which I first thought of as *A is for America*. And I began jotting down ideas for what B, C, and D might be for on scraps of paper.

Q. Your books make history exciting to children. Were you inspired by any books that you read as a child, or read to your children, or grandchildren?

A. I love to read *Goodnight Moon* by Margaret Wise Brown and *Clement Hurd* to my little grandchildren and *The Giving Tree* by Shel Silverstein to all of them. These books inspire me because of the way they not only reach children, but touch adults as well.

Q. What message do you hope your young readers take with them from your books?

A. I hope they understand how amazing this country is, how varied, how beautiful, how free. We live on what Winston Churchill once called the "sunny uplands" of history, and I hope my books help children begin to understand that.

Q. A is for Abigail: An Almanac of Amazing American Women was a New York Times bestseller and received the Oppenheim Toy Portfolio Gold Award. The book profiles several courageous and memorable American women, but do you find one woman particularly inspiring?

A. There are so many, how can I choose? If absolutely forced I'd say the Statue of Liberty, but then there's Mount Rushmore and the Golden Gate Bridge and all the natural wonders. Niagara Falls, the Tetons, the list goes on and on. Aren't we lucky to live in such an amazing country?

Q. Proceeds from your books help to fund the James Madison Book Award, given each July to the book that best represents excellence in bringing knowledge and understanding of American history to children in elementary school and to middle-schoolers. Why was it important to you to help establish such an award?

A. I think of it as multiplying my own efforts to help kids have a greater appreciation of the story of America. There are some really good books written every year, and what I can do is help draw attention to them.

Q. Will you share with us something about your next book for children?

A. I'm working on a book about the Constitution, easily one of the most important documents ever written. It's a remarkable story to be able to tell—how our young country was in serious trouble, until the Framers, meeting in Philadelphia in 1787, created a framework that allowed us to become a great and mighty nation.

Material Review – Picture Book **Turtle Summer: A Journal for My Daughter** by Mary Alice Monroe *Sylvan Dell, April 2007* 9780977742356, Hardcover, \$15.95 9780977742370, Paperback, \$8.95

Organized as a scrapbook for the author's daughter, it documents a summer of observing turtles on an East Coast beach. Starting in May, the loggerhead turtles return to the beach to lay their eggs about 20 inches under the sandy beach. Approximately two months pass as the turtles incubate, then start to hatch and submerge in a "boil." The sand boils over with baby turtles who follow the light of the moon towards the ocean. The book concludes with a full-circle idea that the turtles will return in 30 years to the same beach to lay their own eggs and the author will be there with her daughter to watch them return. Filled throughout with images of marine life on the beach, and quick visit of the Sea Turtle Hospital, the book is a good introduction to the early life of a loggerhead sea turtle. A glossary, loggerhead facts, and ideas of how to make a scrapbook, enhance the book for older readers. This title is recommended for children's collections, especially those with turtle enthusiasts. *JC Peacock, Collection Development Librarian*.

Topics include: physical and mental development, health concerns as detailed as debating vaccinations and allergies. Organized chronologically by months, and with an excellent index, it is easy to find just about any topic of concern for a parent. Apgar scores, diet and nutrition, developmental playing, walking, talking, illness, etc. are explained in enough detail to feel comfortable with the subject at hand. There have been many fairy tale related books lately, but don't overlook this one. The personalities of the characters are fresh and fun and the story is original. The characters have escaped from the Wild and are enjoying their lives beyond their stories: Zel (Rapunzel) runs a hair salon, Cindy (Cinderella) dresses in bright clothes and speeds around in an orange car, the wicked witch runs the Wishing Well Motel, and Snow's seven are grumpy, sexist old men. However, the Wild is again growing strong and the characters may be doomed to forget their lives of free will and be trapped reenacting their stories forever. There are references to familiar old tales as well as some more obscure ones. The latest offering from McCoury Music may be a brand new release, but *Little Mo' McCoury*, the engaging children's bluegrass album from Ronnie McCoury and the Del McCoury Band, has been a long time coming. "It's something I've been wanting to do for a long time," says Ronnie, "probably since my first child was born, and he's nine now!" Yet whether they're bluegrass fans or simply parents in search of a fresh, energetic collection of songs for their children, listeners and, more importantly, their kids are sure to agree that it was worth the wait. From timeless favorites like "This Old Man" and "I've Been Working On The Railroad" to bluegrass classics like "Jimmy Brown The Newsboy" and "Going Ape Over You" and contemporary songs like Randy Newman's "You've Got A Friend In Me" (from Toy Story) and Bob Dylan's "Man Gave Names To All The Animals," *Little Mo' McCoury* is an introduction to bluegrass that reaches out to new generations of children without ever talking down to them.

Based on the graphic novel *Shredderman: Secret Identity, Shredderman Rules* is a Nickelodeon movie about Nolan Byrd, a brainy Junior High school student who is incessantly picked on by the slow-witted school bully Bubba Bixby. Assigned a project of creating a multi-media report on an issue important to him by his teacher Mr. Green, Nolan seeks revenge against Bixby by secretly filming the bully in action and launching a website exposing his despicable behavior. The repercussions of Nolan's actions quickly grow as Bixby's anger boils over and Principal Voss gets involved and implicates Mr. Green in the scheme. In the end, Nolan and his classmates learn an important lesson about taking risks and standing up for what they believe in. <u>back</u>

Clever, attractive, and innovative design ideas fill this book, making it perfect for children and teen craft collections and programs. Provided are 39 suggestions and samples of transformed books that have become unique masterpieces at the hands of young artists. "Think of the book as a blank canvas. To alter it you can draw, paint, write, or paste something in it. Or go to the extremes: Cut holes, weave paper through it....If you can imagine it, you can do it" notes the author. "Circle poems" for example shows highlighted words already printed in the book, manipulating them to read as a poem of the artist's own creation, then covering the rest of the book's page with a painting or collage. What a great way to reuse those books that have been weeded from your collection! The projects could be used for young children to teen art projects, or older children, grades 5+, could use the book on their own. This is a great way to promote the imagination and artist in everyone. Highly recommended! *Jill Faherty, Director of CATS.*

Born addicted to drugs and raised in the projects, Iggy Corso has never had a kind life. Iggy is kicked out of high school, but wants to make something of his life. To do this, he knows he needs to be in school and to get

an education. He doesn't want to be like his drug addicted parents, or many of the people he sees around him. Iggy seeks the help and guidance of his philosophizing, yet naïve, friend Mo who gets himself in trouble with the infamous neighborhood drug dealer Freddy. Together Mo and Iggy go to Mo's mom for money, thinking it is the solution to all their problems. Mo's mom, her lifestyle, and demeanor provide a contrast to any life that Iggy has ever known. He sees that his life could have a brighter future with her help, he becomes more confident and focused on what is right and wrong. Though the people around him don't evolve and are full of contradictions, Iggy finds an inner-spiritual guidance in himself after many unique encounters with good, evil, stupidity, love, hate, neglect and respect. The content and abrupt ending are difficult to swallow. Narrator Hoye's Christopher Walken accent make for an interesting presentation.
